Your Faith is the Victory that Overcomes the World!

► Intro:

- illus.: David and Goliath:
 - Goliath, giant of a man, Philistine, came out and taunted Israel's army twice a day for 40 days (80 times)
 challenged them to send someone out to fight him, if he won the Israelites would serve the Philistines, if Israel won the Philistines would serve the Israelites
 - Israel was afraid, not send anyone out, not engage them in battle
 - David, boy, father sent to check on his brothers and deliver supplies
 - saw what was happening, went to Saul, volunteered to fight and kill the giant
 - David's faith when speaking to Saul:
 - -''The Lord who delivered me from the paw of the lion and from the paw of the bear, He will deliver me from the hand of this Philistine."
 - David permitted David to fight, risking all their lives on a boy
 - David got 5 smooth stones from the brook, and went to the battle line to fight Goliath boy against giant
 - Goliath cursed David
 - David's response to Goliath, showing his confidence, and exemplifying his faith:

-"You come to me with a sword, a spear, and a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have taunted. This day the Lord will deliver you up into my hands, and I will strike you down and remove your head from you. And I will give the dead bodies of the army of the Philistines this day to the birds of the sky and the wild beasts of the earth, that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel, and that all this assembly may know that the Lord does not deliver by sword or by spear; for the battle is the Lord's and He will give you into our hands." – David possessed the victory before he fought – faith – battle belongs to the Lord

- Lord does not deliver by sword or spear He delivers by faith
 - 1 Jn. 5:4b victory that has overcome the world your faith lesson

- ► Your victory you overcome the world! (1 Jn. 5:4) Satan
 - victory: an act of defeating an opponent in a battle or competition our victory is overcoming the world
 - illus.: David killed Goliath, and cut his head off with his own sword victory, defeated
 - illus.: after that, inspired by David, the Israelites defeated the Philistines and plundered their camps
 - overcome: denotes continual action: overcome
 - Present active indicative . . . a continuous victory because a continuous struggle, **''keeps on conquering the world''** ("the sum of all the forces antagonistic to the spiritual life," D. Smith). (Robertson)
- ► 1 Jn. 2:12-14 you have overcome Satan, hence the world victorious, world, Satan
- 1 Jn. 2:3 know God, because you keep His commandments
- ► -1 Jn. 2:13-14 overcome Satan, because word of God abides in you obey word
- ► 1 Jn. 2:15-16 because you've overcome Satan, you don't love the world victorious, world, Satan
- Therefore you are victorious over all the trials and tribulations that come your way, in addition to sin and death! victory, overcome
 - Rom. 8:26-28, 31-35, 36-39 your victory in Christ
- > You are victorious because you believe in Jesus! how
 - 1 Jn. 5:5 you believe Jesus is the Son of God
 you believe in His divinity, though He came in the flesh (vs. 6), which is rejected by antichrists (1 Jn. 2, 4), Gnostics and Jews
- > 1 Jn. 3:23 since you believe Jesus is the Son of God, you believe in the name of His Son Jesus Christ
 - 1 Jn. 4:1 you reject the deceiving spirits, false prophets false religions
 - Col. 3:17 you respect the authority of Jesus do all in His name obey
 - Heb. 5:9 you obey Jesus, the source of salvation to everyone who believes obey, saved
 - illus.: David believed in God, promises, knew he would defeat Goliath because it was God's will
- 1 Jn. 5:6-8 you believe the testimony of the Spirit (word), water (baptism, words from heaven), and blood (cross, sacrifice, resurrection, conclusion of centurion)
 - 1 Cor. 1:18 the word of the cross is the power that's at work in your life salvation
 - 1 Th. 2:13 God's word performs it's work in those who believe fruitful
- ▶ 1 Jn. 5:9-10 you believe the testimony of God miracles, resurrection
 - 1 Jn. 5:10a you have that testimony in yourself confess with mouth, actions
 - 1 Jn. 5:3 love God and keep commandments
 - Therefore you are victorious in your life sin, death, trials and tribulations because believe in Jesus
 - 1 Cor. 15:57 "but thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."
 - Rom. 8:1 "Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

- ► You are victorious because you are born of God! believe Jesus, saved
 - 1 Jn. 5:1, 4 born of God, overcome the world victorious
- ► How are we born of God?

>

- 1 Jn. 5:1a believe in Jesus, born of God
- 1 Jn. 5:5 believe Jesus is the Son of God, therefore obey (above) Heb. 5:9
- What has Jesus commanded for a person to be born again?
 - Jn. 1:12-13 receive Jesus, as the authority of your life, born of God
- ► Jn. 3:3-5 born of water (baptism) and Spirit Jesus commands
 - Acts 2:38 baptized, remission of sins, receive gift of Holy Spirit born again, water, Spirit
 - 1 Cor. 12:13 baptized into body (church, Eph. 1:22-23) spiritual birth
 - Acts 2:47 added to the church (their number)
 - Eph. 5:26 Jesus sanctified the church, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word
 - Tit. 3:5 God saved us, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit
 - Because you believe in Jesus (Son of God), you are born of God, and victorious over the world!
 you obey Him Heb. 5:9

Your victory results in eternal life – victory over the world – sin and death (1 Jn. 5:10-13) – result
 - illus.: David's victory over Goliath was temporal – but your victory in Christ is eternal

- 1 Jn. 2:25 you have the promise of eternal life victorious, world, Satan
 - you have the promise: believe God, have confidence, don't doubt or waver

I Jn. 5:11-13 you know you have eternal life – victory

- the promise from God is so sure, He says you already have it today
- you possess eternal life right now after your physical body dies, your soul will live forever in heaven with God
- 1 Th. 4:13-17; Rev. 20-21 you know what will happen after you die

► Summary / Inv.

- Do you know you have eternal life today? – that God has promised it, and it's so sure the Bible says you already have it today

- illus.: David, believed God and His promises, knew he possessed the victory before going to the battle line, the battle belongs to the Lord

- inv.: If you don't know you have eternal life, you can change that today
 - if not a Christian, not have the victory promised defeat but you can change
 - if a Christian and turned away, have lost your victory but you can get it back
