The Wages of Unrighteousness

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➤ Intro:

- 2 Pet. 2:15 Balaam loved the wages of unrighteousness
 - showed Balak how to tempt Israel and cause them to fall as a result of their sin
 - for personal benefit wages, financial reward
- this lesson: things we should know about the wages of unrighteousness
- ➤ There are many ways people benefit from sin
 - financially:
 - preaching false doctrines, tickling people's ears, for a paycheck (profit)
 - drugs, pornography, prostitution, gambling
 - stealing, robbing
 - social advancement: sinfully manipulating people to put themselves in a better position
 - false accusations to get someone in trouble, to make themselves look better
 - deceiving other people into thinking you're something you're not
 - treating someone mean to make other people laugh
 - etc.
 - anytime a person benefits from sins he commits, it's the wages of unrighteousness
 - What are some things we need to know about the wages of unrighteousness? lesson below
- ➤ The wages of unrighteousness is a strong temptation
 - illus.: Balaam, tempted with financial gain to curse the Israelites
 - resisted at first
 - gave in, unable to curse them, but showed Balak how to put a stumbling block before them whereby they sinned and God punished Israel
- false teachers are doing the same thing as Balaam today, leading people to hell for personal gain
 - 2 Pet. 2:1-2, 15 sensual, greed, exploit others for personal profit, like Balaam
 - illus.: Perganaum, some held teachings of Balaam, eat things sacrificed to idols and commit acts of immorality (Rev. 2:14)
 - benefit from the sin of leading people away from God and to Satan
- ➤ lust of the flesh, lust of the eye, pride of life (1 Jn. 2:16)
 - illus.: temptation, the wages of unrighteousness in everyday life. . . .
 - deceive a teacher or boss so not get in trouble wages of unrighteousness
 - tell a white lie so someone likes you wages of unrighteousness
 - temptation of the benefits of sin are strong
 - Christians: don't give into the temptation, refuse the wages of unrighteousness

- ➤ Wages of unrighteousness only last a short time temporal
 - 1 Tim. 6:7-8 wages of unrighteousness can only last till we die often don't last that long
 - at death, all we can take is who we are, not what we have
 - wages of unrighteousness = moral and spiritual bankruptcy
 - Ja. 4:14 even if wages of unrighteousness last till death, still a short time
 - life is a vapor that is here a short time and vanishes away
- ➤ Ja. 5:1-5 people reaping the wages of unrighteousness should weep and howl
 - they're working for things that will be destroyed
 - they'll pay a bigger price for their sin one day, that they ever got from it
- ➤ We hurt other people more than we get from the wages of unrighteousness Balak, king of Moab
 - illus.: Balaam, showed Balak how to tempt Israel and cause them to fall as a result of their sin
 - Num. 24:1-11 God caused a plague to come upon the Israelites and 24k died
- Num. 31:1-18 God had Israel destroy the Midianites, plunder and destroy their cities, kill all the males, and all the women except for girls who hadn't known a man intimately, killed Balaam
 - it would have been better for all parties, if Balaam had been faithful to God, and rejected the wages of unrighteousness
 - the best thing we can do for ourselves and others is be faithful to God, and reject the wages of unrighteousness
 - illus.: when tempted to lie for personal gain, better not to, for everyone's sake
 - illus.: when tempter to deceive someone for personal gain, better not to, for everyone's sake
 - illus.: when tempted to take something that's not our's, better not to, for everyone's sake
 - illus.: when tempted to gossip, better not to, for everyone's sake
- ➤ Wages of unrighteousness are small compared to God's gift
 - Heb. 12:15-17 not come short of God's grace, by accepting the wages of unrighteousness
 - illus.: not immoral or godless like Esau, who sold birthright for a meal, later couldn't get it back
- illus.: Judas, betrayed Jesus for 30 pieces of silver "price of wickedness" (Acts 1:18)
 - 30 pieces of silver in today's \$ = \$30.85 \$.66 each (ISBE) X 30 X annualized inflation of 3%
 - Judas enjoyed the money for about 2 days, then died and eternal lost as the son of perdition (Jn. 17:12)
 - wages of unrighteousness were under \$31.00, had it 2 days, didn't get to spend, lost eternally
 - sold soul to Satan for \$31.00 many today doing the same thing
 - the benefits we receive from sin are small compared to what we lose
 - the benefits of sin never come close to matching what we lose in exchange
 - Satan pays very little for sin, compared to God's gift of eternal life
 - Esau received a swallow of stew, Judas receive about \$30.00
 - "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul? (Matt. 16:26)

- ➤ Wages of unrighteousness have eternal consequences Balaam killed, Israelites died, Midianites decimated
 - Rom. 6:23 wages of sin, death (hell, eternal damnation)
 - final wages paid for sin (unrighteousness), hell
 - illus.: Balaam "loved" the wages of unrightoueness (2 Pet. 2:15), but he certainly doesn't love the eternal wages
- ➤ Matt. 16:26-27 Jesus returning to repay everyone, according to deeds
 - What will you receive when the Lord returns? Rom. 6:23
 - wages of sin, hell
 - gift of God, eternal life in Christ
- ➤ Summary / Inv.
 - to reject the wages of unrighteousness, our love must be in the right place
 - 2 Pet. 2:15 Balaam "loved" the wages of unrighteousness more than God
 - we reject the wages of unrighteousness, because we love God more
 - illus.: love God more than the benefits from lying to someone
 - illus.: love God more than the benefits from deceiving someone
 - illus.: love God more than what we receive from stealing
 - illus.: love God more than the benefits of gossiping
 - as Christians, we. . . .
 - love God with all our heart soul mind strength (Mk. 12:30)
 - serve one master, not two (Matt. 6:24)
 - reject the wages of unrighteousness, to faithfully serve God, and go to heaven
