I want to be a Christian because I want to be strong!

Intro:

- → illus.: mother with young children, husband died, wanted to be strong for her children but had a hard time keeping herself together before and after the funeral
 - ! wanted to be strong
 - ! did not know where to find the inner strength to do the hardest thing she ever had to do continue life without her husband
- ➤ → The secret is Jesus!
 - ! Phil. 4:12-13 secret, do all things
 - ! the secret to triumphing in every situation --- "Jesus"
 - **→** This lesson:
 - ! Title: I want to be a Christian because I want to be strong!
 - ! Purpose / Convince: to convince you to become a Christian (remain faithful as a Christian) so that you will have the spiritual strength you need to fight the battles of life
- What does Paul mean in Phil. 4:13?
 - → "can do" (Greek, ischuo, vb.): to be strong, to have power
 - ! Christians have a "can do" attitude:
 - ! illus.: Senator John McCain's story of a fellow-poisoner (POW) during the Vietnam war
 - ! saying: where there is a will, there is a way can do attitude, strong with power
 - ! Christians have a will to obey God, so they always find a way
 - ! This verb is **from the Greek noun** *ischus* (is-khoos'). e.g., Ephesians
 - **! Eph. 1:18-20** in accordance with the working of the strength of His **might** (Greek, *ischo*) which He brought about in Christ
 - ! Eph. 6:10 in the strength of His might (Greek, *ischo*).
 - ! Application: strength to do all things comes from God the strength of His might
- ➤ → "all things" (Greek, pas, adj.): adj. we can do all
 - ! nothing excluded
 - ! illus.: Paul:
 - ! 2 Cor. 11:23b-27 labors, imprisonments, beaten, danger of death, scourged five times, beaten with rods, stoned, etc.
- ➤ "through" (Greek, en, prep.): preposition denoting (fixed) position (in place, time or state), and (by implication) instrumentality: the instrument by which we "can do" all things is **Christ**
 - ! illus.: you go to town in the car
 - ! the instrument you used to get to town was the car
 - ! without the car we would not have gotten to town
 - ! application:
 - ! we are spiritually strong through Christ
 - ! without Christ, we are spiritually weak
 - ! Application: Without Jesus we can do nothing! With Jesus we can do all things!

- ➤ "strengthens" (Greek, endunamoo, vb.): to receive strength, be strengthened, increase in strength
 - ! "Causative verb to empower, to pour power into one" (A. T. Robertson).
 - ! verb action that is done by Christ He pours power into us
 - ! The same Greek phrase in the aorist tense appears in 1 Tim. 1:12:
 - ! 1 Tim. 1:12a our Lord, who has strengthened me, ...
 - ! Paul's strength was from the Lord he would remain strong as long as the Lord continued to strengthen him
 - **Application:** the Lord strengthens us to accomplish "to do all things" which we must do in His service
- ➤ Context: Our aim as Christians is to know Christ and His power—to attain to the resurrection of the dead
 - ! Phil. 3:8-11 surpassing value of knowing Jesus, through faith in Christ, know Him and the power of His resurrection, attain to the resurrection from the dead
 - ! Phil. 4:13 do all things through Jesus, who strengthens me
 - ! Application: Spiritual strength to win life's battles comes from being a Christian know Christ and His power! do all things through Christ

Conclusion:

- → Summary: You can do all things through Jesus Christ
 - access to God, prayer, strength, spiritual needs net, physical need met, emotional needs met, eternal life in heaven
 - ! Phil. 4:13
- → Inv.:
