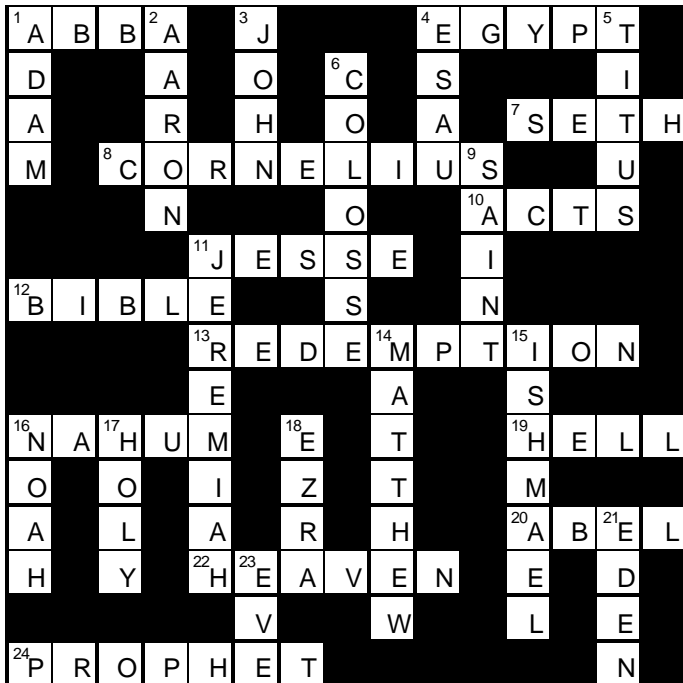


## Basic Vocabulary Series I: Puzzle 8
